Tam presented Scottish football comedy TV show Offside, also a live show at the King's Theatre, Glasgow.

In 2010, Tam presented It's Never Too Late, a six-part documentary series for STV on literacy and numeracy difficulties among adults.

He was also a guest presenter for STV's overnight interactive strand The Nightshift and rejoined the station in 2011 as a presenter for the lifestyle magazine show The Hour.

For 16 years Tam was a restaurant critic and reviewer and additional columnist with the Daily Record. He moved to The Scottish Sun in 2014.

Tam presents the comedy football radio show Off the Ball on BBC Radio Scotland along with Stuart Cosgrove.

Eric is recognised as one of Scotland's finest After Dinner Speakers, Comedians and Speech Writers.

He was raised in that Cultural Cul De Sac, the Creme de la Skimmed Milk of all Scottish mining villages, Newtongrange, eight miles south of Edinburgh.

At the age of 11, Eric loved the stage. His Stylophone rendition of Chuck Berry's 'My Ding-A-Ling' took the Newtongrange Church Opportunity Knocks competition by storm.

In his teens he tried Ventriloquism, but ended up too heavy for the guy's knee!

After a spell at thrashing a drum kit around for a local Punk Rock band, Eric started writing and performing comic Poetry around the Clubs and Bars of Edinburgh and Glasgow.
