Coronavirus (COVID-19) and entering or returning to the UK

From 8 June, there will be <u>new rules</u> in place for entering the UK because of coronavirus (COVID-19). The rules are for residents and visitors. When these rules are in place, you will:

- need to provide your journey and contact details when you travel to the UK
- not be allowed to leave the place you are staying for the first 14 days you are in the UK except in very limited situations (known as 'self-isolating').

You do not need to complete the form or self-isolate if you are travelling from Ireland, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, and you were there for 14 days or more.

<u>Some travellers</u>, including some specific workers, will be exempt from new English border rules. These workers may need to show a letter from their company or the company they are coming to work for at the border. More details are available <u>here</u>. While these rules apply to the England only, it is very likely similar rules will be applied in Scotland and the other UK nations.

Final date for the furlough scheme

The UK Government have confirmed that the final date by which an employer can furlough an employee for the first time will be 10 June 2020, in order for the current three-week furlough period to be completed by 30 June 2020. Employers will have until 31 July to make any claims in respect of the period to 30 June. Further details can be found here.

Trade Credit Insurance backed by £10 billion guarantee

Trade Credit Insurance, which provides essential cover to hundreds of thousands of business-to-business transactions, will receive up to £10 billion of government guarantees.

- The Trade Credit Reinsurance scheme, which has been agreed following extensive discussions with the insurance sector, will see the vast majority of Trade Credit Insurance coverage maintained across the UK.
- The guarantees will support supply chains and help businesses during the coronavirus pandemic
 to trade with confidence, safe in the knowledge that they will be protected if a customer
 defaults or delays on payment.
- The scheme is available on a temporary basis for nine months, backdated to 1 April 2020, and available insurers operating in the UK market.

Scottish Parliament Summer Recess Scrapped

MSP's have today (4th June) agreed to keep the Scottish Parliament running throughout the usual summer recess. MSPs will meet weekly throughout summer, each Thursday, via virtual statement led sessions, with the First Minister delivering statements at Holyrood on 9th and 30th July.

These dates are planned coincide with the three-week review cycles. Should all criteria met, these could be the earliest dates for introducing new phases of the route map. Parliament will resume fully on 11th August, when schools are planned to reopen.
