First Ministers Speech, 26th June

In today's <u>Daily Briefing</u>, the First Minister focused on the reopening of all retail premises with outdoors entrances from Monday 29^{th.} Guidance was due to be published today for consumers setting out the basic rules that all of us need to follow, in order to keep safe ourselves and to help keep others safe too. The guidance is clear that there are some people who should not be going into shops at all for now - for example, those who have COVID-19 symptoms and are self-isolating, and those who are in the shielding group.

New Online DYW E-Portal for Summer School Leavers

Developing the Young Workforce have launched a new online portal E-DYW, aimed at supporting young people leaving school this summer to take their next steps in life. The One-Stop-Shop for young people, educators, employers, parents/carers, can be accessed here and includes multiple resources from private and public sector bodies to provide support to young people leaving school.

A series of sessions have also been created to support both young people, parents and carers delivered through Scotland's Biggest Parents Events and the DYW Skills Academy. The first Scotland's Biggest Parents Events (SBPE) will take place on 7th July; more details <u>here</u>. The DYW Skills Academy: Get Industry Ready will be delivered over July and August is a series of activities and virtual experiences with industry to support young people to build capacity to enter the labour market. Public Procurement Blog: CPN 2/2020 duration extended: CPN 6/2020

The latest <u>Public Procurement Blog</u>, published 25th June, highlights the new <u>Construction Policy Note (CPN)</u> 6/2020. This policy note advises that the guidance in <u>CPN 2/2020</u> has been extended. The guidance remains applicable after 30 June and will expire after 30 September.

Sustainable Procurement Duty Tools

A <u>recently launched</u> new single platform for the Flexible Framework, Prioritisation Tool and Sustainability Test has resulted in over 60 registrations to date from across the public sector in Scotland. The single

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platform, which provides easier access to the tools and guidance, was developed using one of the Scottish Governments <u>national frameworks</u> resulting in a contract award to a Scottish SME. Scottish Parliament Recess

The Scottish Parliament will be in recess from 27 June to 9 August inclusive. However, it is expected to meet weekly each Thursday throughout the summer period. These will be virtual meetings, other than on 9 and 30 July, when there will be hybrid meetings, with MSPs in the Chamber or participating remotely.

Vehicles guidance update

The vehicles guidance has been updated to include details on amending the 2m social distancing rule and details on support bubbles. Please note that while the devolved administrations in Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland have inputted into this BEIS UK guidance, as public health is devolved, it should be considered alongside Scottish Government guidance on social distancing. Pay Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme grants back if you have over-claimed

- You'll need your 14- or 15-digit payment reference number that begins with X

Applying for a moratorium under the Corporate Insolvency & Governance Act 2020

How to apply for breathing space to consider a rescue plan for your company, under measures to support companies and other types of business in financial difficulty. The directors must file for or apply to court for a moratorium. It will give the company 20 business days to consider rescue options. Find out more here.
